

Online Student Etiquette

However, we do strongly believe that our mission is to raise up disciples for Christ by promoting academic, social, and spiritual excellence. Classroom instruction is paramount to the success of our mission. We consider all online students as part of the classroom. Be prepared, this etiquette will not be the same as it was in the emergency situation when we suddenly had to have all of our students online. Online classroom students will be held to the same standards as onsite classroom students. Classroom unity, CGCA academic standards and CGCA behavior standards are still in place. Just as good behavior benefits the entire program, negative behavior damages the program and must be dealt with accordingly.

We encourage all parents to support and assist in maintaining a positive learning environment for all our students.

Adherence/breach of etiquette will affect participation grades. Participation grades carry test value scores.

1. All students must be seated in a chair, in front of a computer screen, on time at 8:30 am. Students not present at homeroom check in will be recorded as Tardy/Absent.
2. All students must be seated in a chair in front of a computer screen on time at the scheduled start of each class. Students not present at class check in will be recorded as Tardy/Absent and result in a drop of participation grade.
3. All students must be in uniform for all classes.
4. Students must keep the channel unmuted and remain seated and in frame unless permission is given by the instructor to deviate.
5. NO eating or drinking during class sessions.
6. NO use of cell phones without permission from the instructor.
7. Students must be keenly aware of their background/surroundings. Unkept and distracting backgrounds may result in class dismissal and loss of participation grade.
8. Poor behavior or deviation from etiquette may result in class dismissal and loss of participation grade.
9. Assignments posted to Renweb should be completed on time to avoid any reduction in grade.
